### Judiciary Act, 1968

**An Act to enable judicial appointments to be made from persons who have held office or practised in the Commonwealth and South Africa.**

#### **1. Short title**

This Act may be cited as the Judiciary Act, 1968.

#### **2. Under sections 98 and 144 of the Constitution**

The Republic of South Africa shall be a prescribed country for the purposes of section 98 and of the definition of "high judicial office" in section 144 of the Constitution.

#### **3. Under section 106 of the Constitution**

All Commonwealth countries and the Republic of South Africa shall be designated countries for the purposes of section 106 of the Constitution.
