#### LEGAL NOTICE NO. 140 OF 2010

#### THE FINANCE MANAGEMENT AND AUDIT ACT, 1967 (Act No. 17 of 1967)

#### THE FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT AND ACCOUNTING (PUBLIC HEALTH) REGULATIONS, 2010 (Under Section 29)

#### Citation and commencement.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Financial Management and Accounting (Public Health) Regulations, 2010, and shall come into force on 1<sup>st</sup> April, 2011.

#### Interpretation.

2. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires;

"orphan or vulnerable child" means an orphan or a child who is below the age of 18 years and who is faced with life challenges and includes a differently-abled child, an abandoned child, an abused child; a street child, a child labourer, a child political refugee, a child affected by HIV/AIDS and a child whose family is in conflict;

"clinician" means a medical doctor having direct contact with, and responsibility for treating, patients, and includes a nurse attending a patient;

#### Fees and charges.

3. Subject to Regulations 3 to 8 of these Regulations, the charges and fees listed in the Schedule shall be the charges and fees payable for services rendered or to be rendered at all Government health facilities.

#### Applicable higher rates.

4. (1) A patient who is on medical aid will be required to pay the medical aid rate.

(2) A Non-resident general out patient shall be charged three times the charges and fees set out in the Schedule.

#### Exemptions for the elderly.

5. (1) A resident of Swaziland who is over the age of 60 years shall be exempt from the payment of the charges and fees set out in the Schedule.

(2) A person who wishes to benefit from the exemption set out in sub-Regulation (1) shall be required to produce a Swaziland National Identification Card or other such positive proof of identity and age as may be required.

#### Exemptions of Tuberculosis, leprosy and mental patients.

6. A patient seeking treatment for tuberculosis, leprosy or a mental ailment shall be exempt from the payment of the charges and fees set out in the Schedule.

#### Exemptions on request and application.

7. (1) A patient who is a prisoner or who is in the custody of the police shall be exempt from the payment of charges and fees set out in the Schedule on the written request of the Commissioner of Correctional Services or the Commissioner of Police, as the case may be.

(2) Notwithstanding sub-paragraph (1), a request made under this Regulation may be made by the officer in charge of the prisoner or the officer in charge of person in custody and may be made verbally followed up by a written confirmation of the request.

(3) A person, other than a person to whom an exemption applies in terms of these Regulations, and whom is unable to pay charges and fees set out in the Schedule, may have the said charges and fees waived, provided that, that person or the legal guardian of that person produces documénted evidence of the inability from the Social Welfare Department or the Director of Health Services.

(4) Where the person seeking exemption under sub-Regulation (3) is an orphan or vulnerable child, it shall be sufficient for that child or the legal guardian of that child to produce a letter from the Social Welfare Department or Chief of the Umphakatsi where the orphan or vulnerable child is a resident requesting the exemption.

#### Re-attendance.

8. A person may not be afforded the benefit of exemption under these Regulations within seven days of having previously enjoyed such benefit unless authorised by the attending clinician.

#### Repeal.

9. The Financial Management and Accounting (Public Health) Regulations, 1998, are hereby repealed.
